

Exodus 12: 24-28

And you shall observe this thing as an ordinance for you and your sons forever. ²⁵ It will come to pass when you come to the land which the LORD will give you, just as He promised, that you shall keep this service. ²⁶ And it shall be, when your children say to you, 'What do you mean by this service?' ²⁷ that you shall say, 'It *is* the Passover sacrifice of the LORD, who passed over the houses of the children of Israel in Egypt when He struck the Egyptians and delivered our households.' " So the people bowed their heads and worshiped. ²⁸ Then the children of Israel went away and did so; just as the LORD had commanded Moses and Aaron, so they did.

Jesus at the wedding

John 2: 1-2

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. ² Now both Jesus and His disciples were invited to the wedding. ³ And when they ran out of wine, the mother of Jesus said to Him, "They have no wine."

Mark 1: 9 -13

It came to pass in those days *that* Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee, and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰ And immediately, coming up from the water, He saw the heavens [d]parting and the Spirit descending upon Him like a dove. ¹¹ Then a voice came from heaven, "You are My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."

¹² **Immediately** the Spirit drove Him into the wilderness. ¹³ And He was there in the wilderness **forty days, tempted by Satan**, and was with the wild beasts; and the angels ministered to Him.

Luke 4: 13

Now when the devil had ended every temptation, he departed from Him until an **opportune time**.

John 2: 1-5

Day 1- day after Jesus returns from the wilderness he is choosing disciples – Andrew and Simon

Day 2 – he is gathering more disciples- Philip and Nathaniel

Hab 2: 15 -Woe to him who gives **drink to his neighbor**, Pressing him to your bottle, Even to make him drunk, That you may look on his nakedness!

1 Pet 4: 3 For we have spent enough of our past lifetime in doing the **will of the Gentiles**—when we walked in lewdness, lusts, **drunkenness**, revelries, **drinking parties**, and abominable idolatries.

John 2: 6-10

Now there were set there six waterpots of stone, according to the manner of purification of the Jews, containing twenty or thirty gallons apiece. 7 Jesus said to them, "Fill the waterpots with water." And they filled them up to the brim. 8 And He said to them, "Draw some out now, and take it to the master of the feast." And they took it. 9 When the master of the feast had tasted the water that was made wine, and did not know where it came from (but the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom. 10 And he said to him, "Every man at the beginning sets out the good wine, and when the guests have well drunk, then the inferior. You have kept the good wine until now!"

Matt 11:18-19

18 For John came neither eating nor drinking, and they say, 'He has a demon.' 19 The Son of Man came eating and drinking, and they say, 'Look, a glutton and a winebibber, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!' But wisdom is justified by her children."

Matt 9:10-13

10 Now it happened, as Jesus sat at the table in the house, that behold, many tax collectors and sinners came and sat down with Him and His disciples. 11 And when the Pharisees saw it, they said to His disciples, “Why does your Teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?”

12 When Jesus heard that, He said to them, “Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. 13 But go and learn what this means: ‘I desire mercy and not sacrifice.’ For I did not come to call the righteous, but sinners, to repentance.”

The words of King Lemuel, the utterance which his mother taught him: 2 What, my son?

Exodus 12: 3-11 - PASSOVER

Speak to all the congregation of Israel, saying: 'On the tenth of this month every man shall take for himself a lamb, according to the house of his father, a lamb for a household. 4 And if the household is too small for the lamb, let him and his neighbor next to his house take it according to the number of the persons; according to each man's need you shall make your count for the lamb. 5 Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male of the first year. You may take it from the sheep or from the goats. 6 Now you shall keep it **until the fourteenth day of the same month**. Then the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill it **at twilight**. 7 And they shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and on the lintel of the houses where they eat it. 8 **Then they shall eat the flesh on that night; roasted in fire, with unleavened bread and with bitter herbs they shall eat it. 9 Do not eat it raw, nor boiled at all with water, but roasted in fire—its head with its legs and its entrails.** 10 You shall let none of it remain until morning, and what remains of it until morning you shall burn with fire. 11 And thus you shall eat it: **with a belt on your waist, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand. So you shall eat it in haste.** It is the LORD's Passover.

Exodus 12: 14 -20 Feast of Unleavened Bread

So this day shall be to you a memorial; and you shall keep it as a feast to the LORD throughout your generations. You shall keep it as a feast by an everlasting ordinance. 15 **Seven days you shall eat unleavened bread.** On the **first day you shall remove leaven from your houses.** For whoever eats leavened bread from the first day until the seventh day, that person shall be cut off from Israel. 16 On the **first day there shall be a holy convocation,** and on the **seventh day there shall be a holy convocation for you.** No manner of work shall be done on them; but that which everyone must eat—that only may be prepared by you. 17 So you shall observe the Feast of Unleavened Bread, for on this same day I will have brought your armies out of the land of Egypt. Therefore you shall observe this day throughout your generations as an everlasting ordinance. 18 **In the first month, on the fourteenth day of the month at evening, you shall eat unleavened bread, until the twenty-first day of the month at evening.** 19 **For seven days no leaven shall be found in your houses, since whoever eats what is leavened, that same person shall be cut off from the congregation of Israel, whether he is a stranger or a native of the land.** 20 **You shall eat nothing leavened; in all your dwellings you shall eat unleavened bread**



Rules

Passover

- 14th day prepare at twilight
- How to prepare
- Eat at evening
- What parts to eat
- Eat with unleavened bread and bitter herbs
- Sandals, belt, staff and eat it fast

Feast of Unleavened Bread

- Remove all yeast from house for 7 days
- Holy Gathering on Day 1 & Day 7
- Eat Start 14th day at evening ends on the 21st
- Anyone who partakes yeast during this time is cut off

Luke 22: 7- 13

Then came the Day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover must be killed. 8 And He sent Peter and John, saying, "Go and prepare the Passover for us, that we may eat."

9 So they said to Him, "Where do You want us to prepare?"

10 And He said to them, "Behold, when you have entered the city, a man will meet you carrying a pitcher of **water**; follow him into the house which he enters. 11 Then you shall say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says to you, "Where is the guest room where I may eat the Passover with My disciples?" ' 12 Then he will show you a large, furnished upper room; there make ready."

13 So they went and found it just as He had said to them, and they **prepared** the Passover.

Luke 22: 14-20

When the hour had come, He sat down, and the twelve apostles with Him. 15 Then He said to them, “With fervent desire I have desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer; 16 for I say to you, I will no longer eat of it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God.”

Passover is over – insert John 13 Account

17 Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and said, “Take this and divide it **among yourselves**; 18 for I say to you, I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes.”

19 And He took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and **gave it to them**, saying, “This is **My body** which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me.”

20 Likewise He also took the **cup after supper**, saying, “This cup is the **new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you**



That verse says don't get

Ephesians 5: 16-21

See then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, 16 redeeming the time, because the days are evil.

17 Therefore **do not be unwise**, but understand what the will of the Lord is.

18 And do not be drunk with wine, in which is dissipation; **but be filled with the Spirit**, 19 speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord, 20 giving thanks always for all things to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, 21 submitting to one another in the fear of God.
