- Talking The things you want to tell others; what you're excited to share
- Reading What occupies your attention; the media you're consuming

### TALKING

#### TALKING

- Our speech is an indicator of what's going on inside. Bad speech, like bad fruit from a tree, shows how deeply sin is ingrained in our thinking (Luke 6:43-45). Be sure that God takes our language seriously (Matt. 5:22, 12:36-37, Ecc. 5:6, James 1:26, 3:6).
- The apostle Paul addresses some very specific "trail markers" in our language (Ephesians 4:29-5:12).
- The positive side is that speech can also be good and uplifting. It can be useful, not detrimental. It can be a big part of the fruit we produce for God (1 Pet. 3:9-11, Col. 3:8-10, 4:6, Prov. 19:20, 18:21).

## READING



 Of course we're talking about much more than just reading. It's about input — the media that occupies our attention and, if allowed, will dominate us.

God wants your mind on His side, not just empty actions (Rom. 12:2, Psalm 40:6-10). He wants us to consider His words, His laws, His written will, and direct our thoughts toward Him (Psalm 119). Reading and belief (1 Jn. 1:1-4, Rom. 10:17).

This is why prayer and meditation are so important.
 When worldly noise is silenced, God's voice doesn't have to compete for your attention (Hab. 2:20, Ps. 62:5-6, Zeph. 1:7, Luke 10:39, Mark 1:35, Ps. 37:7

# AND INEVITABLY LEADING

#### CONSEQUENCES

- We are all walking down one trail or another. Life is going somewhere.
  Either we are living worldly lives, dominated by worldly things, with
  worldly goals. What we talk about and what we consume is a reflection
  of this priority. Or we are heavenward people, and every part of life is
  subject to that priority (Romans 8:5-14).
- Remember that you essentially become what you prioritize (Psalm 115:4-8). It is as inevitable as following a trail and arriving at the destination that was indicated by markers the entire way!
